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DH IMPLEMENTATION PROCESS

- **DH Dementia programme Board**
 - Oversee implementation over next 5 years
- **Implementation Reference Group**
 - Key stakeholders. Meet twice year.
- **NDS Implementation Group**
 - Clinical and nurse advisor, policy and implementation leads
 - National – driving programmes for each of the 17 themes
- **Regional Implementation Programme**
 - DH Implementation teams developed in each region
 - Partnerships with Joint Improvement Partnerships, SHA, Alzheimer's Society,
- **Funding**
 - £150 million over 2 years; £60 2009/10 and £90 2010/11
 - PCT baseline budgets



SW Dementia Strategy Group

- taking a regional overview of the progress regarding implementation of the National Dementia Strategy
- seeking to influence and enhance local delivery, measured against the outcomes in the National Strategy
- co-ordinating deployment of people and financial resources associated with regional support for implementing the National Strategy
- assessing and highlighting innovative practice in dementia services across the South West
- building strong networks relating to dementia services, both across the region and nationally

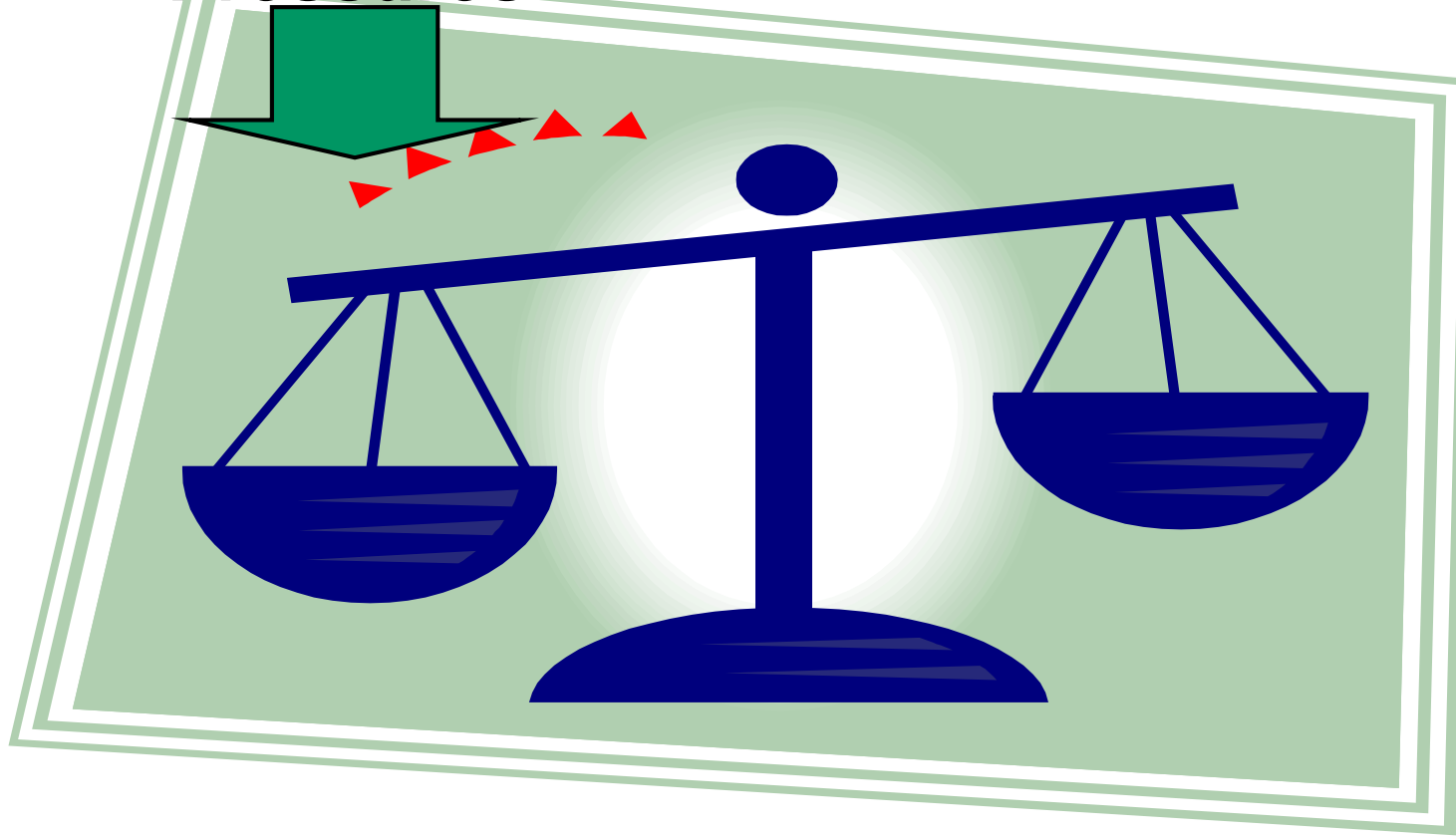


What we have done so far

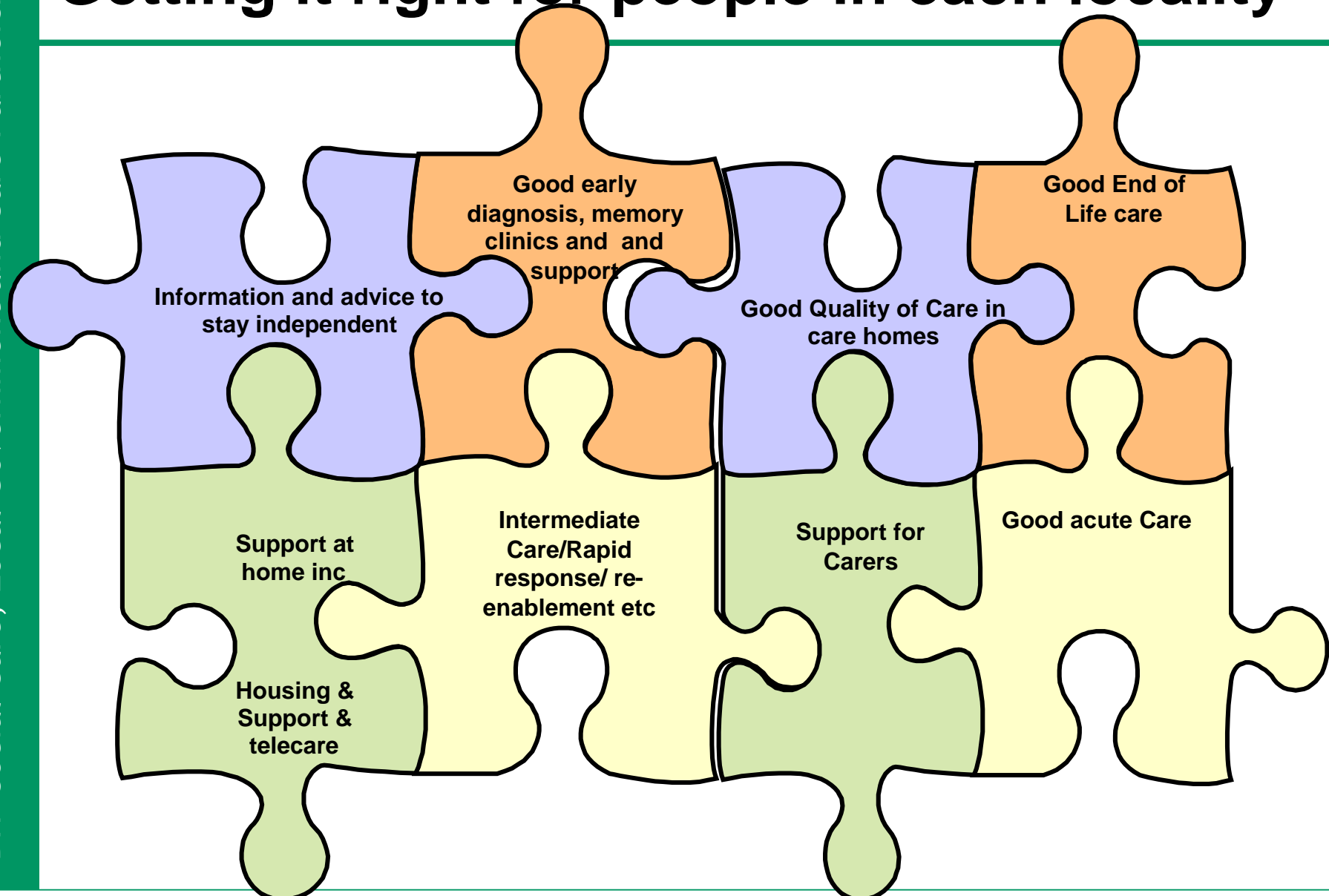

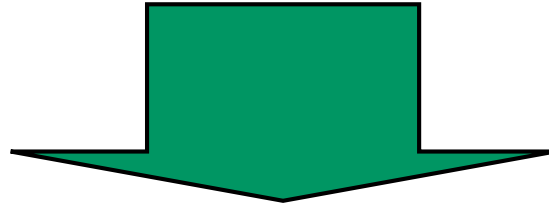


The Challenges
